Marin Project Coordination Meetings

Marin County Stormwater Pollution Prevention Program (MCSTOPPP) holds monthly project coordination meetings to review and guide projects through the environmental and regulatory permit process. Input from regulators can help you design and implement projects that have minimal impacts to natural resources while achieving your goals. Landowners share their prospective creek or wetland projects for free input and constructive feedback from staff at the permitting agencies. These meetings are intended to provide a forum for interaction and input, not public comment or regulatory action. Meetings are non-binding and informal. Formal comments and input will be provided once a permit application has been submitted.

Each project proponent will be given approximately 30 minutes on the agenda, if time permits, to share their project and receive feedback. Landowners or their representatives are encouraged to present their project with photos, sketches, plans, maps, or presentations. Projects may be very conceptual and nothing at all is required to present your ideas at this meeting. We can provide a computer and projector, if requested.

Our schedule is based on availability of state, federal, and local staff. Agency staff can include: County of Marin, San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board, California Dept. of Fish and Wildlife, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, NOAA Fisheries, BCDC, and others.
