Program Updates:

• **Finance Committee:** The committee had its first meeting to review potential new policies and financial endeavors (Reserves, RCD Foundation, Fee for Service, etc.). This month's Draft Financial Report is an outcome of our initial meeting. Staff will investigate other financial strategies to be presented to the Board.

- Marin Coastal Permit Coordination Program The Program requires reauthorization this year therefore new practices should be examined for inclusion. Staff will present new conservation practices at the July Board meeting. Fifteen restoration projects were included the 2016 Marin Coastal Permit Coordination Program announcement which was posted in the Point Reyes Light and on the Marin RCD website last month. No public comments were received.
- **Marin Carbon Project** –A soil monitoring field day for RCD/NRCS staff was a great success! NRCS will be developing standardized soil monitoring protocol for RCD use. Three carbon farm plans are in progress. The Marin Climate Action Plan was reviewed to determine next steps for carbon farming role.
- **Black Mountain Roads** Tasks remaining: fencing and minor erosion control work.
- **Urban Streams Coordinator** The USC planned/organized a few activities: 1) a restoration event with the Marin Municipal Water District and AmeriCorps in Woodacre on June 18th, 2) a series of educational lectures with UC Cooperative Extension Service and the Seashore regarding native seed collection and propagation and 3) a lecture about urbanization and watershed impacts to a hydrology class offered by Northern CA Branch Chief of National Marine Fisheries Service, Bob Coey. (see USC report for details).
- **Americano Creek Watershed** The Carbon Farm Planning process is open for applications http://goldridgercd.org/projects.html Moody Dairy is in planning stages for a rainwater catchment system.
- **Conserving Our Watersheds:** Staff worked on contract negotiations for COW PATI with the State Water Board. A Scope of Work is drafted for contract signature.
- Media/Outreach: No activity.
- **Grant Proposals:** Received MALT application for possible permit coordination program application. The Lexicon of Sustainability wants to pair up with Marin RCD to write a grant for the sustainable agriculture artwork throughout West Marin.
- **District:** Staff has been investigating County Creek Permits and Design Review compliance for restoration projects. Staff consulted with County Counsel re proposed consulting contract changes.
- Landowner Requests: 7 requests for landowner assistance.
