- **Urban Streams Program:** The US Coordinator received six requests for site visits and even more requests for general guidance around permit compliance and creek health. The US Coordinator attended the annual Salmonid Restoration Federation conference in Davis which enabled an opportunity to grow professionally, learn up to date restoration techniques for salmonids and network in order to secure new partnerships/advisors in Marin. USC Program is currently seeking a different funding source to implement the Landowners Assistance Program since FRGP (Fisheries Restoration Grant Program) funds did not come through.
- **Finance Committee:** The Finance Committee has reviewed staff salaries and a proposed salary schedule. Retirement benefits have not been reviewed. A copy of the Marin RCD Financial Procedures were reviewed and are provided for your information.
- Marin Carbon Project 4 carbon farm plans are complete. 5 are underway. All will be complete by end of July. Staff gave presentations to Hog Island Oyster staff and the Blue Circle in San Mateo County.
- **Dairy CARES**: Staff is completing a series of maps for seven dairy producers to assist with compliance with the Dairy General Order located in the SF Bay Region. The General Order for the North Coast Region is expiring and public meetings will be held in the near future.
- **Black Mountain Roads** Fencing and erosion control work were completed by the landowner as a matching contribution to the grant. This project is now complete!
- Americano Creek Watershed Gold Ridge RCD is proceeding with carbon farm plans for orchards. The design for the rainwater catchment / greywater project at the Valley Ford Cheese Company has been completed and construction is planned.
- **Conserving Our Watersheds:** Nine projects are complete! Four planting projects are now complete! Twelve new projects have been submitted by landowners for funding.
- Media/Outreach: Reviled invasive taking root in San Geronimo Valley, Samantha Kimmey, Point Reyes Light.
- **Grant Proposals:** RCD staff is currently working on a proposal to address roads in the Walker Creek watershed. We are currently working on Hog Island Oyster Company's Earth Day "Let's give a shuck" event.

Staff investigated requirements of the CA Statewide Groundwater Elevation Monitoring Program. Performance evaluations and salary comparisons were completed. Board and Staff have completed Tier 1 RCD compliance. Ethics Training is now completed for all directors!!!!
