• **Biomass Project:** The Biomass Project is in the beginning stages of onboarding the new Project Manager, Chad White, PhD. A Request for Proposals was posted on the Marin RCD website for a Biomass Utilization Study with Greenhouse Gas Assessment.

• **Conserving Our Watersheds Program:** 4 COW CCAF projects in planning and designing phase. Designs for 2 projects are finalized, 2 project designs are ~60% complete. 1 project delayed due to land managers more pressing concerns. 3 COW CCAF program participants supported EQIP applications, which were submitted 5/27/22.

• **Urban Streams Program**: Sarah continues to work with CDA in her role supporting the agency with the roll out of the Stream Conservation Area Ordinance in San Geronimo, the BOS hearing is set on Tuesday, July 19th for review and approval (then it would go into effect 90 days later). Marin Water District would like to renew the contract for monitoring support with Sarah/Marin RCD. USC carried out two site visits and provided support to many stakeholders during the month of June. Finally, Sarah organized and led the June Lagunitas TAC meeting as the Chair, which had a great series of presentations and an overall good turnout in attendance.

• **Carbon Farming Program**: <u>State Coastal Conservancy</u>: New projects are delayed by one year due to staff being redirected to Public Request Act assignments. <u>Wildlife Conservation</u> <u>Board</u>: 2 CFP designs complete, and 4 underway. Chileno Valley Ranch CFP underway. Wildlife-friendly hedgerow pamphlet at printer! <u>Department of Conservation-Stemple Creek</u> <u>Restoration</u>: Fence planned for Summer 2022, and plant installation by STRAW for Fall 2022. <u>CDFA Healthy Soils Program</u> CDFA has awarded 940 projects for the 2021 Solicitation. List of awarded projects here (from CDFA website). \$1.4 Million awarded to 17 Marin producers for compost application, range planting, hedgerow planting, and riparian forest buffer!! Marin RCD will continue to update <u>design and implementation resources on our website</u> and provide postaward soil sampling and implementation assistance in coordination with STRAW, UCCE, and MALT. • Walker Creek Watershed: The second TAC meeting took place in the field, on June 3rd. As well, PCI Design Team is moving forward with the analysis of data which has resulted in preliminary conceptual designs to create off-channel habitat along three properties within the project reach.

UPDATES:

USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service – Sebastian Tsocanos informs the Board that NRCS is in full swing in Construction mode with summer projects. They have a Forestry Intern working in the office which is welcome support. NRCS also has a Point Blue Biologist assisting them at this time as well.

- Marin Agricultural Land Trust/SAP Eric Rubenstahl shares that MALT Executive Director search is going well and it seems they should have a decision by this month. MALT is also ramping up their operations and acquisitions staff. Eric also states staff is out in full force monitoring easements. Scott Dunbar highlights the new fiscal year for SAP is starting so please send any interested landowners their way. DRAWS program, which applies to greater agricultural Marin landowners, is starting its new fiscal year with additional funds.
- Point Blue & Students & Teachers Restoring a Watershed Jesse shares that STRAW is in the depths of water monitoring on all of their projects. She also mentions their Conservation Community College Internship Project has started which teaches the fundamentals of habitat and watershed restoration. Also, staff continue to seed collect for future projects. Isaiah shares they are excited to implement the project at Stemple Creek this fall –securing plants,

working with students and site prep. A big part of their work going forward will be wrapping up the CF designs we talked about today. Point Blue has been asked by the State of CA to submit a full proposal for a re-granting program to support agriculture.
